What are the main themes?

There will be workshops about systemic racism, discrimination due to gender, migration, disability etc., the online criminalization of children, the justice system in the pandemic or the voice of children in the justice system.

All children and young people should have the same rights in all justice systems no matter of ethnicity, religious beliefs, socio-economic status, sexual orientation, gender, disability etc.
