These are just some of the consequences which can result from violence towards children. While recovery is possible, governments and non-governmental agencies must immediately make available the financial resources necessary to implement effective preventative strategies.

Special measures are needed to protect the most vulnerable children: ethnic minorities, the LGBT community, the disabled, unaccompanied children, those in alternative care systems, those in the juvenile justice system.

Violence towards children can be perpetrated by children as well as adults. Victims of bullying are 9 times more likely to consider suicide than their non-bullied peers. More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of children involved in bullying are both victims and perpetrators.⁷
