Specific Objective

Reinforce and empower Palestinian CSOs and CBOS active in the protection of the rights of the child and gender equality by ensuring a higher level of their effectiveness, inclusiveness, proactiveness through innovation capacity building development, effective funding and networking and advocacy support.

DOMAIN 1

Civil Society Strengthening - Core Programming

Different levels of reinforcement at the level of CSOs/CBOs:

- > Strengthened CSOs/CBOs technical and institutional capacity/competencies to drive specialized, diversified, multi-sectoral and comprehensive gender, rule of law and protection programming.
- > Strengthened CSOs/CBOs organizational and financial sustainability through an effective and comprehensive sub-granting scheme.
- > Strengthened CSOs/CBOs effective networking, monitoring, advocacy and knowledge capitalization and dissemination.

DOMAIN 2

Accountability of Duty Bearers

- > Increased political will to reform decision-making structures and promote civil space and synergies between formal and informal authorities to support CSOs/CBOs initiatives
- > Reinforced links between government and CSOs/CBOs.
- > Increased evidence-based advocacy from CSOs/CBOs allows for discussion spaces with formal and informal stakeholders.
- > Strengthened gender-responsive accountability processes include civic engagement actions.

DOMAIN 3

Social Norms

- > Discriminatory social and cultural norms are challenged (public/private spheres).
- > Boys and men are engaged in transforming gender norms.
- > Customary/religious community/influential leaders engaged with CSOs/CBOs work's in gender, rule of law and protection.
- > Young narratives gaining community and media exposure and acceptance. Positive portraying of young leaders.
